This statement is in relation to 13 arrests I made on THURSDAY 08TH SEPTEMBER 2022 at 10:56AM at MOSQUITO WAY, HATFIELD for Aggravated Trespass and Criminal Damage. I was on duty and in full uniform

I became aware of an incident at the site and attended. When I first arrived on scene, I activated my personal issue body worn camera (P33021) which I have since uploaded to DEMS. My body worn camera picks up my initial attendance and shows the suspects on top of the lorry and then shows me walking them out of the facility and then me arresting them on the green of MOSQUITO WAY.

I arrived inside the Arla site at Hatfield and became aware of 13 persons within the site that clearly shouldn't be there. I drove on to the site in to a large area where lorries were stationary and alighted from my marked police vehicle. I could see a cab of a lorry that was without a trailer and the tops of heads of a number of people around it and on top of it. Initially, I was the only uniformed officer present that I was aware of albeit I came to know that there was another officer present wearing all black. I observed the persons on the cab of the lorry and reported back to our control room as to what the situation on site was.

As I stood and observed those on the lorry, I could also see further people behind them walking around being watched by PCSOs that had arrived before me and staff from the site that were identifiable from their High vis jackets. They were all within the fenced and gated boundary of Arla and were holding flags and talking to eachother and they had been corralled by staff and PCSOs. Those on the lorries then started to come down to the ground and join the others in to a group. I then watched as the group started to walk towards the gates of Arla and myself and the PCSOs were around them, walking with them whilst I was communicating with our control room and waiting for further officers to arrive.

The group walked out of the site and sat on a bank of grass next to a roundabout outside the site on Mosquito Way. I remained with them, as did the PCSOs.

I then received information that the persons had entered the site and used drills to drill holes in to numerous lorry tyres causing damage. After a few more officers arrived, upon instruction from Inspector SUCH, I read out the time which was 10:56AM and said "YOU ARE ALL UNDER ARREST ON SUSPICION OF CRIMINAL DAMAGE AND AGGRAVATED TRESPASS – YOU DO NOT HAVE TO

None of the 13 persons I arrested made any response to caution after being arrested, they just all looked at me and smiled and seemed to understand why they were being arrested. Due to the number of prisoners, other officers at the scene then assisted in the physical detention and search of prisoners and conveying them to available custody suites. I was not aware of the names of the 13 persons I arrested at the point of arrest but I have subsequently reviewed the custody suites and images of detainees and can now as a result identify them by name.

I have reviewed all of the HATFIELD & STEVENAGE prisoners and have confirmed their details.

Myself and PC 157 ORCHARD (NB535) conveyed 3 prisoners to Stevenage custody suite. Robert HOUSTON custody reference 41E1/3525/22 and I took photographs of him which I exhibit as JM/01,2 and 3 along with a further detainee, Bryan MONGELLI custody reference 41E1/3526/22 who I did not have the opportunity to obtain images of. The third prisoner was Radim SANDR custody reference 41E1/3523/22 and I exhibit images of him as JM/04, 5 and 6. I also seized SANDR's mobile phone which I exhibit as JM/07 and have uploaded this to the PMS system under the reference: B2/043710/22.

I have then reviewed all of the custody records and incident log and have established the continuity of which officers conveyed which of the persons I arrested and ultimately the identity of those I arrested.

PC 509 GILES (NB745) - conveved Nikola MURATOVA custody reference 41E1/3522/22 to STEVENAGE CUSTODY, from reviewing the custody photo, I can confirm that this is the female that was part of the protest group I arrested.

PC 1044 HALL and PC 451 PHILLPOTTS (ND528) conveyed Vojtech PALENCAR custody reference 41E1/3524/22 to STEVENAGE CUSTODY. Images of the suspect were obtained by PC 1044 HALL and from reviewing these images shown to me by PC HALL, I can confirm that this is the male that was part of the protest group I arrested.

I was on duty under callsign TS45 double crewed with PC 63 JONES when a call was received that there were potential protesters on site at ARLA FOODS, 4000 MOSQUITO WAY, HATFIELD.
While on route to the location I heard on the radio that NB521 had arrested one on suspicion of criminal damage.
I arrived and overheard from staff that the group of protesters had used drills to drill through lorry tyres within their fleet. I was directed to the other side of the building where the group had now rur off to.
As I got to the other side of the building, I noted a large group of approximately fifteen people moving around the building away from me. As I pulled up, I noticed two males both holding a drill each in their hands. The male on the right was holding a yellow and black drill in his right hand and the male on the left was holding a dark coloured drill in his right hand. I therefore got out of my vehicle, approached both males and said "STOP, STAND STILL, YOU ARE UNDER ARREST OF SUSPICION OF CRIMINAL DAMAGE" I fully cautioned both males with no reply from either and I placed one of the males I now know to be Vaclav OPATRIL into handcuffs in a rear stack as I noted that my colleague had continued walking towards other members of the protest group and I was now on my own with two arrested. I then said TIME OF ARREST IS 1023HRS. The other male I arrested I now know to be Stephen BONE appeared to be compliant as well as the other female who I now know to be Cristina ACOSTA. All three sat down on the floor. INVESTIGATION BY MEANS OF AN INTERVIEW AND TO PREVENT ANY FURTHER DAMAGE TO PROPERTY". I did not place BONE in handcuffs as my colleague PC JONES returned to me.

During this time, I could hear that the remainder of the group had left the inside of the site within Arla and had made their way back around to the pedestrian entrance and were now outside. I waited for a further unit to arrive to assist in conveying. I also placed both seized drills into separate evidence bags and placed them into the boot of my marked police vehicle.

I then searched both arrested males under section 32 of PACE prior to placing them into the rear of my marked police vehicle where I found nothing further of any significance.

I then received direction from Oscar One that anyone within the grounds of Arla should be arrested on suspicion of aggravated trespass. I therefore explained to ACOSTA, "TIME IS 1047HRS, I AM ARRESTING YOU ON SUSPICION OF AGGRAVATED TRESSPASS, Fully Cautioned with no significant response and then said, "NECESSITY FOR ARREST IS FOR A PROMPT AND EFFECTIVE INVESTIGATION BY MEANS OF INTERVIEW AND TO PREVENT AND FURTHER DAMAGE TO PROPERTY".

I then spoke to both arrested males and further arrested OPATRIL at 1055hrs and BONE at 1056hrs on suspicion of AGGRAVATED TRESSPASS. I explained to both males that the same caution still applies.

I then conveyed both OPATRIL and ACOSTA in my vehicle along with PC JONES and PC 281 along with PC 2573 conveyed BONE to Hatfield custody where all three detention was further authorised by the custody sergeant. During this time, I took head to toe pictures of the suspects which I will exhibit as:

and the other one was female and I cannot remember the sex of the other protester. I remember seeing one of the drivers try to stop the protesters and they pushed past him like they did not care.

The next thing I remember is feeling panicky. I suffer from panic attacks due to anxiety and over the last few months it has got worse, I am currently waiting to see a specialist about this. I remember feeling scared and uneasy about seeing the protesters. I started to shake and I felt really worried. I was worried about what the protesters might do. The protesters didn't really look at me or look like they wanted to get into the building however, it was the uncertainty of what they would do which is what made me feel scared and anxious. In the twelve years I have worked at ARLA I have never experienced any protests so this experience was new to me. I remember sitting down on the bottom step because I was worried I was going to pass out and hurt myself. Two of my colleagues KELLY and CHRISTINA, who are first aid trained, were standing near me and came to my aid. I felt myself going to pass out but KELLY held me so I didn't. I remember my chest starting to feel really really tight and I felt like I couldn't breath properly. Both KELLY and CHRISTINA were talking to me saying things like 'BREATH BREATH'. I then went back into the office and sat down. At this point I remember feeling really dizzy and I could see black spots flashing before my eyes. I usually experience the flashing when I am having a panic attack. I believe this whole incident lasted about 5 minutes. I am also suffering from acid reflux which is bought on by stress.

Two hours after the incident I am still feeling shaky and anxious. Due to the security situation, I am unable to leave the building and walk around which is how I usually cope with my anxiety. This is making me feel much worse. I haven't been able to eat properly since the incident as I feel sick. I have tried to work as normally as I can however, I cannot concentrate due to the anxiety I feel. It is taking me much longer to concentrate on tasks due to how I feel. I do not know if I will be able to come back to work tomorrow. It will depend on how anxious I feel when I wake up. I feel angry that the protesters have wasted time and money. There will be drivers for example, who will now have to work later and this makes me feel angry and upset that they will not see their families.

UPON the Claimants' Application dated 26 January 2023 seeking (i) the adjournment of the final hearing of the Claimants' Claim for final injunctive relief against the Defendants, pending the outcome of the expedited appeal to the Supreme Court in *Wolverhampton City Council & Ors v London Gypsies and Travellers & Ors* (UKSC 2022/0046), which appeal may dispose of part of these proceedings, (ii) the continuation of the Injunction Order dated 27 May 2022 granted by HHJ Simon (sitting as a Judge of the High Court) (the 'Injunction Order'), pending the outcome of the aforementioned appeal and the final hearing of the Claimants' Claim and (iii) a 12 month extension to the power of arrest contained within the Injunction Order

AND UPON the Application being made on notice to those Defendants who have acknowledged service of the Claim and provided an address for service, as per paragraph 11 of the Injunction Order, and with the Application having also been served on the solicitors for the Sixty-Third Defendant and by way of email on the Forty-Eighth, Fifty-First, Eighty-Sixth, One-Hundred and Second and the One-Hundred and Fiftieth Defendants

AND UPON the Court considering the terms of the Injunction Order and the recitals thereto

AND UPON the Court considering the Fourth witness statement of Adam Rulewski dated 25 January 2023

AND UPON the Court considering the Application on the papers and without a hearing

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Definitions

- 1. For the purpose of this Order:
 - 1.1 "The Roads" shall mean the Roads identified in Annexe 1 to this Order and to the Claim Form as marked in red on the maps at Annexes 2 and 3 to this Order and to the Claim Form.
 - 1.2 "The Administrative Area of Thurrock" shall mean the administrative area as marked with the purple line on the map at Annexe 2 to this Order and to the Claim Form.
 - 1.3 "The Administrative Area of Essex" shall mean the administrative area as marked with the pink line on the map at Annexe 3 to this Order and to the Claim Form.
 - 1.4 "The Administrative areas of Thurrock and Essex" shall mean those areas in 1.2 and 1.3 above.
 - 1.5 "The Fuel Terminals" shall refer to the following four sites collectively:

- 1.5.1 The Navigator Fuel Terminal, Oliver Road, West Thurrock RM20 3ED;
- 1.5.2 The Esso Fuel Terminal, London Road, Purfleet RM19 1RS;
- 1.5.3 Exolum Storage Ltd, off Askews Farm Lane, London Road, Grays RM17 5YZ; and
- 1.5.4 Oikos Storage Limited, Haven Road, Hole Haven Wharf, Canvey Island, Essex SS8 0NR.

INJUNCTION

Prohibitions

- 2. Until and subject to any further order of the Court, the Defendants and each of them (whether by themselves or by instructing, encouraging or allowing any other person) are <u>forbidden</u> from:
 - 2.1 Blocking, slowing down, endangering, obstructing or otherwise interfering with the flow of traffic onto or along or off **the Roads** for the purpose of protesting.
 - 2.2 Blocking, slowing down, endangering, obstructing or otherwise interfering with access to or from the Roads, and on any adjacent roads, slip roads or roundabouts which are not vested in the Claimants, for the purpose of protesting.
 - 2.3 Entering, climbing onto, climbing into, climbing under **any vehicle** travelling on to, off or along **the Roads** or accessing or exiting the Roads: (a) without the permission of the registered keeper of the vehicle; and (b) for the purpose of protesting.
 - 2.4 Entering, climbing onto, climbing into, climbing under **any vehicle** on any **adjacent roads**, **slip roads or roundabouts to the Roads**, whether or not those roads are vested in the Claimants: (a) without the permission of the registered keeper of the vehicle; and (b) for the purpose of protesting.
 - 2.5 **Affixing themselves** ("locking on") to any vehicle travelling on to, off or along the Roads or accessing or exiting the Roads.
 - 2.6 Affixing themselves ("locking on") to any vehicle on any adjacent roads, slip roads or roundabouts to the Roads, whether or not those roads are vested in the Claimants, where the "locking on" is for the purpose of protesting.
 - 2.7 Affixing themselves ("locking on") or any other items to any of the Roads or any other person or object on, under or over the Roads.
 - 2.8 Affixing themselves ("locking on") or any other items to any adjacent roads, slip roads or roundabouts to the Roads, whether or not those roads are vested in the Claimants where the "locking on" is for the purpose of protesting.

- 2.9 **Erecting any structure** on the Roads.
- 2.10 **Tunnelling**, excavating, drilling or digging under or adjacent to the Roads.
- 2.11 **Occupying** existing tunnels under the Roads for the purpose of protesting.
- 2.12 **Causing damage** to the surface of or to any apparatus on or adjacent to the Roads or any vehicle on the Roads for the purpose of protesting.
- 2.13 **Abandoning any vehicle** or item on any Roads, adjacent roads, slip roads or roundabouts to the Roads, whether or not those roads are vested in the Claimants for the purpose of protesting.
- 2.14 Blocking, slowing down, obstructing or otherwise interfering with vehicular access to **any petrol station** in the administrative areas of Thurrock and Essex for the purpose of protesting.
- 2.15 Blocking, endangering, slowing down, obstructing or otherwise interfering with vehicular access to any **petrol station forecourt or access road**, in the administrative areas of Thurrock and Essex for the purpose of protesting.
- 2.16 Blocking, endangering, slowing down, obstructing or otherwise interfering with the offloading by **delivery tankers of fuel supplies** and/or the refuelling of vehicles at any petrol station within the administrative areas of Thurrock and Essex.
- 2.17 **Causing, assisting** or encouraging any other person to do any act prohibited by paragraphs 2.1 to 2.16 above.
- 2.18 **Continuing any acts** prohibited by paragraphs 2.1 to 2.16 above.

Power of arrest

3. Pursuant to s.27 Police and Justice Act 2006, a power of arrest shall apply to paragraphs 2.1 to 2.16 above in the form attached at schedule 3 of this Order.

Alternative service

- 4. Pursuant to CPR rules 6.15 and 6.27, the Claimants shall have permission, in addition to personal service, or in the alternative to personal service, to serve the 1st to 222nd **Defendants** and any further named Defendants with the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order and the power of arrest by all of the following methods (4.1 4.5 to be treated conjunctively):
 - 4.1 **Websites:** placing a copy of the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order and the power of arrest on the Claimants' websites and Facebook pages; and

4.2 **Email:** sending a copy of this Order to Just Stop Oil, Youth Climate Swarm, Extinction Rebellion and Insulate Britain at the following email addresses: juststopoilpress@protonmail.com; youthclimateswarm@protonmail.com; press@extinctionrebellion.uk; insulatebritainpress@protonmail.com and providing a web link at which they can access the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order; and

- 4.3 **Post:** where an address of a named Defendant is known to the Claimants, by posting a copy of this Order together with a covering letter through the letterbox of the named Defendant's address (or by leaving in a separate mailbox) with a notice affixed to the front door if necessary, drawing the recipient's attention to the fact that the package contains a court order. If the premises do not have a letterbox, or mailbox, or the package will not fit through the letterbox, a package may be left next to the front door and a notice containing this Order may be affixed to the front door marked with a notice drawing the recipient's attention to the fact that the package contains a court order and Claim Form and should be read urgently. The notices shall be given in the form set out in Schedule 2 to this Order; and
- 4.4 **Text messages:** sending a text message to any named Defendant for whom the Claimants have a mobile telephone number, notifying them that an injunction order has been granted against them with a power of arrest, and providing a web link at which the Defendant can access the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order. The notice shall be given in the form set out in Schedule 2 to this Order; and
- 4.5 **Placing signs:** on A-Road entry points and exit points to the administrative area of Thurrock, and within 50 metres of The Fuel Terminals and on the A130 and B1014 between the entrance to Canvey Island and the roundabout known as the Waterside Road roundabout on Canvey Island, stating that there is a High Court Injunction in place prohibiting protest on the highway and providing a web link and QR code at which the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order and the power of arrest can be accessed; or
- 4.6 **Where requested:** the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order and the power of arrest may be served by email where the Defendant has requested that they be served by email and by sending the email to the address provided by the Defendant; or
- 4.7 **Lawyers:** By serving any solicitor acting for a Defendant who has filed a notice of acting in these proceedings.

- 5. The **deemed date of service** of any documents referred to in paragraph 4 above shall be the day on which service of the document or documents is completed in accordance with paragraph 4 above.
- 6. Pursuant to CPR rules 6.15 and 6.27, the Claimants shall have permission to serve the **223**rd **to the 229**th **Defendants** with the Claim Form, Application for an Interim Injunction, the supporting documents relied on in this Claim, and this Order and the power of arrest by the methods in paragraphs 4.1, 4.2 and 4.5 above (to be read conjunctively).
- 7. The **deemed date of service** of any of the documents referred to in paragraph 6 above shall be the day on which service of the document or documents is completed in accordance with paragraph 6 above.
- 8. The Defendants shall acknowledge service of the Claim Form 21 days after the deemed date of service and file any written evidence in support of the Defence by the same date.

Further directions

- 9. The Defendants or any other person affected by this order may apply to the Court at any time to vary or discharge it but if they wish to do so they must inform the Claimants' solicitors at the same time as the application is filed at court (and in any event not less than 48 hours before the hearing of any such application, not to include weekends or public holidays).
- 10. Any person applying to vary or discharge this order must provide their full name and address, an address for service, and must also apply to be joined as a named defendant to the proceedings at the same time (to the extent they are not already so named).
- 11. The Claimant has permission to apply to extend or vary this Order or for further directions. The Claimant must serve any such application on those Defendants who have acknowledged service and provided an address for service.

Final hearing

12. The Claimants shall write to the Court within 28 days of judgment in the appeal of Wolverhampton City Council & Ors v London Gypsies and Travellers & Ors (UKSC 2022/0046) being handed down (i) to inform the Court that judgment has been handed down and (ii) proposing directions to bring this Claim to final hearing. The Claimants shall copy that correspondence and the proposed directions to any Defendant who has acknowledged service of the Claim and provided an address for service.

13. Costs in the case.

- 3. A requirement to serve on 'Defendant' means on each of them. However, the Order is effective against any Defendant on whom it is served in accordance with this Order.
- 4. An Order requiring 'the Defendant' not to do anything applies to all Defendants.
- 5. This Order contains the following schedules and annexes

 - (ii) Schedule B-Witness Statements;
 - (iii) Schedule 1-List of Named Defendants;
 - (iv) Schedule 2-Notices;

Nine Just Stop Oil supporters found guilty after disrupting the UK's largest oil terminal

Court & Prison, Press / March 8, 2023

Nine Just Stop Oil Supporters have been found guilty after causing disruption to the flow of oil out of the largest fuel terminal in the country in 2022. The Just Stop Oil supporters were demanding that the government halt licensing and consents for the development of any new fossil-fuel projects in the UK. [1]

Tez Burns Rik Vanhoutteghem and one other appeared before Judge Donoghue, at Chelmsford Magistrates Court, on Monday. All three were charged with aggravated trespass at Navigator Fuel Terminal in Grays, Essex, on the 4th April 2022. Tez Burns was sentenced to an 18 month conditional discharge with costs of £215 and Rik Vanhoutteghem was given a 60 hour community order, with costs of £270. Michael Brown pleaded guilty to the charge of Aggravated Trespass, at Navigator, on the 1st April 2022, and was given a 40 hours community order, as well as fees of £160. [2]

Rosa Sharkey, Oliver Stevens and Alexandra Mulvey appeared before Judge Donoghue on Monday and Tuesday, also charged with aggravated trespass, at Navigator, on the 4th April 2022. In addition, they have been charged with wilful obstruction of the highway, at the same terminal, on the 1st April 2022. Rosa Sharkey, Oliver Stevens and Alexandra Mulvey have each been fined £414 inclusive of court fees and surcharge.

Louis McKechnie, and Matthew Powell appeared on Monday and Tuesday, solely in relation to obstruction of the highway, at Navigator, on the 1st April 2022. Louis McKechnie was fined £354, inclusive of court fees and surcharge. Matthew Powell received a 12 month conditional discharge and was charged £144 in fees. [3]

Speaking after the trial on Tuesday, Oliver Stevens, 20, a biology student from Bristol, said:

"I took action with Just Stop Oil out of desperation to secure a future that is liveable, both for my generation and future generations."

"We are seeing normal members of the public realising that the government will not commit to any meaningful actions to prevent irreversible climate breakdown, and so we are left with little choice but to force the government to act."

A Just Stop Oil spokesperson said:

"History will not look kindly on the judges that have criminalised these good people for taking a stand against an industry that is wreaking havoc on our communities. Oil companies have bought our politicians and engaged in a concerted effort to lie about the impact of burning fossil fuels and mislead the public for decades. As the worst drought in 500 years continues across Europe, crops are failing and currently we are already seeing rationing in supermarkets."

"We say to all those working in the judiciary, who are co-operating with these trials; take a stand, or let history be the judge of you. Those complicit in climate crimes will be held to account one day, it is simply a matter of time."

Since the Just Stop Oil campaign launched on the 14th February 2022, there have been over 2,000 arrests and 138 people have spent time in prison, many without trial. There are currently two Just Stop Oil supporters and two Insulate Britain supporters in prison whilst awaiting trial or serving sentences for actions taken with the campaigns.

We stand with these four supporters in prison, with the 1,800 victims of our broken criminal justice system, imprisoned for over a year without trial and with the 1,700 murdered across the global south, for protecting all our lives. [4] [5]

This is the moment for us to come together and resist the destruction of everything we love, something that is being imposed on us by a few, who only seek to enrich themselves.

We're done with begging. We are going to stop new fossil fuel projects whether those in power agree or not. As citizens, parents and children, we have every right under British law to protect ourselves and those we love.

We are the last generation who can solve this. Will you step up? Join us and Just Stop Oil.





Sandringham Estate: Three charged after lambs stolen

Three lambs were taken from a field on the Sandringham Estate in Norfolk in May

Three women have been charged after lambs were stolen from a field on the King's Sandringham Estate.

Protest group Animal Rising previously claimed to be behind the theft at West Newton, Norfolk, in May.

Norfolk Police said Sarah Foy, 23, Rose Patterson, 34, and Rosa Sharkey, 23, had been charged with theft and animal welfare offences.

They were released on police bail and are due to attend King's Lynn Magistrates' Court on 28 September.

Ms Foy, of North Street, Alfreton, Derbyshire; Ms Patterson, of Homerton High Street, London; and Ms Sharkey, of Mayville Estate, London, have each been charged with:

- One count of stealing three lambs from a farm in West Newton between 24 and 25 May
- Three counts of causing unnecessary suffering to a protected animal between 24 and 25 May
- Three counts of failing to record movement of an animal on 24 May.

- Today, Animal Rising has released a photo of the three lambs rescued from the Sandringham Estate last May. The photo shows the lambs fully grown, happy, and healthy.
- On 24/5/23, three women (Rose, Sarah, and Rosa) rescued three lambs from King Charles Ill's
 Appleton Farm to save them from being killed for meat and begin "a national conversation about
 our broken relationship with other animals and the natural world" [1].
- Despite saving the lives of the three animals, the three women are set to stand trial at Norwich Crown Court later this year [2].

An updated photo of the animals has been released almost a year after the rescue of three lambs belonging to King Charles III. The photo shows the animals fully grown and happy, a sharp contrast to the late they would have experienced if left unsaved.

Sarah Foy, one of the women who rescued the animals said:

"It's heartwarming to see Sammy, Sunny, and Sooty grown up and enjoying life; they'll now have the opportunity to reach their full lifespan of a decade or more. It's incredible to hear about the bond the three have formed with each other. In a nation of animal lovers, this is how sheep, cows, chickens, and all animals should be able to live."

The release of this photo comes shortly after Animal Rising released a photo of one of the beagles the group rescued from MBR Acres in 2022 [3]. Since Summer 2022, the group has rescued a total of 28 animals on three separate occasions - putting the spotlight on industries such as animal testing and farming.

The action also aimed to highlight the environmental damage caused by animal farming and fishing, with around 16% of UK land is dedicated purely to sheep grazing, whilst providing less than 1% of dietary calories [4].

In 2018, comprehensive research from the University of Oxford showed that 76% of the land currently used for food production would be freed-up by a global transition to plant-based production [5]. This land could be rewilded and begin carbon drawdown, mitigating the worst impacts of climate breakdown.

Dan Kidby, Co-Founder of Animal Rising said:

"I believe that we truly are a nation of animal lovers. Many of us wouldn't hesitate to help a dog trapped in a hot car, and the rescue of Sammy, Sunny, and Sooty is no different. We all have the urge to step up and defend innocent life, and now is the time to bring that compassion to the surface and create a better world for all life."

Animal Rising is a social movement to create a new relationship with all beings and give us a chance for a safe ecological future. The group primarily calls for the transition to a secure and sustainable plant-based food system, alongside a mass rewilding programme.

Sandringham Sheep Rescue: Further Footage Released



- Animal Rising has released further footage of the "open rescue" of 3 sheep from the royal estate at Sandringham yesterday evening [1] [2].
- The group can confirm the animals have not been returned to the farmer or released into the wild, they are safe and with animal experts who will care for them and allow them to live happily.
- The rescuers, Rosa Sharkey, Sarah Foy, and Rose Patterson are now in police custody at Maidanhand

Rosa Sharkey, 23, said:

"Our actions yesterday have saved a family of sheep from slaughter; but they've also asked a broader question about our broken relationship with animals and nature. We've rescued sheep from Sandringham because the Royal Family, more than any other, have a responsibility to lead by example and show the way towards tackling the climate and nature crises. The sheep here are living beings, worthy of freedom just like any one of us.

King Charles is a self-proclaimed environmentalist and nature lover, it is up to him to put right on that. He and his family are the global representatives of a nation known for being animal lovers - they ought to show it."
